

FUTURE WITH WILL (1)

We use 'will' to talk about future events we believe to be certain or an action in the future that cannot be influenced.

- o Next year, I'll be 40.
- There won't be any snow. It's too warm.
- o The concert will be on 24th May.
- Often we add 'perhaps', 'maybe', 'probably', 'possibly' to make the belief less certain (opinion, hope, uncertainty or assumption regarding the future).
- o I'll probably come back later.
- o Perhaps we'll meet again some day.

FUTURE WITH WILL (2)

We often use 'will' with the verbs **hope**, think, be sure, believe, suppose:

- oI think I'll go next year.
- oI think I'll go to bed now.
- oI think she'll do well in the job.
- oI hope you'll enjoy your stay.
- oI hope you won't make too much noise.

FUTURE WITH WILL (3)

We use 'will' at the moment we make a new decision or plan (a spontaneous decision).

- oIt's very cold. I'll close the window.
- •Bye. I'll phone you when I get there.
- oI'll answer that.
- oI'll go.

FUTURE WITH WILL AND ADVERBS OF CERTAINTY

- o Will comes before the adverbs certainly, definitely, probably, undoubtedly, surely in affirmative sentences and after the adverb in negative sentences.
- o I'll definitely go. (certain)
- o I certainly won't go. (certain)
- o I'll probably stay. (quite certain)
- o I probably won't stay. (quite certain)

Adverbs of certainty express how certain or sure we feel about an action or event.



PRESENT CONTINUOUS WITH FUTURE MEANING (NEAR FUTURE)

• Present Continuous and Present Simple can be used to talk about the future.

We use the Present Continuous for <u>plans and</u> <u>arrangements</u>.

What are you doing tonight? I'm seeing a very important client in my office at 7 o'clock.

Where are you staying in London?



PRESENT CONTINUOUS VS GOING TO

- Going to is used to talk about future plans and intentions.
- The **present continuous** is used to talk about future arrangements (a time and place are decided)
- a) I'm going to see Mary again. (a decision has been made but no arrangement)
- b) I'm seeing Mary tonight at the restaurant at 10. (an arrangement has been made with Mary).
- With **go** and **come**, the present continuous is generally used:

I'm going to Australia.
