REPORTED SPEECH

Statements: When transforming statements check whether you have to change:

- o pronouns
- o present tense verbs (3rd person singular)
- o place and time expressions
- o tenses (backshift)

direct speech "I speak English."

reported speech

(no backshift) He says that he speaks English.

reported speech

(backshift) He said that he spoke English.



REPORTED SPEECH

We use a 'reporting verb' like 'say' or 'tell'. If this verb is in the present tense, it's easy. We just put 'he/she says' and then the sentence:

- o Direct speech: "I like ice cream".
- Reported speech: She says (that) she likes ice cream.

But, if the reporting verb is in the past tense, then usually we change the tenses in the reported speech (backshift):

- o Direct speech: "I like ice cream".
- o Reported speech: She said (that) she liked ice cream.3

REPORTED SPEECH

Occasionally, we don't need to change the present tense into the past if the information in direct speech is still true (but this is only for things which are general facts, and even then usually we like to change the tense):

- ${\color{red} \circ}$ Direct speech: "The sky is blue".
- o Reported speech: She said (that) the sky is/was blue.



DIRECT SPEECH	INDIRECT SPEECH
today	that day
yesterday	the day before
the day before yesterday	two days before
tomorrow	the next day/the following day
the day after tomorrow	in two day's time
next week/year etc.	the following week/year etc.
last week/year etc.	the previous week/year etc.
a year etc. ago	a year before/the previous year

HOW ABOUT QUESTIONS?

Questions: When transforming questions, check whether you have to change:

- o pronouns
- o present tense verbs (3rd person singular)
- o place and time expressions
- o tenses (backshift)

Also note that you have to:

- o transform the question into an indirect question
- \circ use the interrogative or if / whether

HOW ABOUT QUESTIONS?

Wh- questions

o Direct speech: "Where do you live?"

The tense changes are the same, and we keep the question word. But we need to change the grammar to a normal positive sentence.

- o Direct speech: "Where do you live?"
- Reported speech: She asked me where I lived.
- o Direct speech: "Where is Julie?"
- o Reported speech: She asked me where Julie was.



DIRECT AND REPORTED WH- QUESTIONS

Direct question	Reported question
Where is the post office, please?	She asked me where the post office was.
What are you doing?	She asked me what I was doing.
Why don't you speak English?	He asked me why I didn't speak English.



HOW ABOUT QUESTIONS?

Yes/No questions

We use 'if' or "whether"

- o Direct speech: "Do you like chocolate?"
- Reported speech: She asked me if I liked chocolate.



DIRECT AND REPORTED YES/NO QUESTIONS

Direct question	Reported question
Do you love me?	He asked me if I loved him.
Have you ever been to Mexico?	She asked me if/whether I had ever been to Mexico.
Are you living here?	She asked me if/whether I was living here/there.



 - \rightarrow He wanted to know
- o The teacher asked, "Who speaks English?"
 - → The teacher wanted to know
- o "How do you know that?" she asked me.
 - → She asked me
- o "Has Caron talked to Kevin?" my friend asked me.
 - \rightarrow My friend asked me
