Self-certifications must be signed by the candidate in presence of a public official committed to the receipt of the documentation. If the documentation is sent through post mail or delivered by means of other individuals, self-certifications must be signed by the candidate and accompanied by a photocopy of each face of a valid pictured identity document.



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EU citizens can submit self-certifications according to art. 46, 47 and 19 of D.P.R. n. 445/2000.

Extra EU citizens, residing legally in Italy, may provide self-certifications according to art. 46 and 47 of D.P.R. n. 445/2000 (only with reference to situations, personal qualities and facts which can be certified or attested by Italian public bodies).

## OFFICIAL CERTIFICATES THAT CAN BE REPLACED BY SELF-CERTIFICATION

According to art. 46 of D.P.R. n. 445/2000, citizens, under their responsability, are allowed to use self-certification instead of official certifications to provide information about:

- · date and place of birth;
- · domicile;
- $\cdot$  citizenship;
- · enjoyment of political rights;
- marital status;
- · family membership;
- · proof of being alive;
- birth of a child;
- · death of a spouse, ancestor or descendant;
- · military service status;
- enrolment in associations or lists required by the public administration;
- · academic qualifications;
- · professional qualifications;
- state and university exams completed;
- · postgraduate qualifications;
- · other recognised competencies/qualifications;
- training course qualifications;
- · refresher course qualifications;
- technical qualifications;

 $\cdot$  income or financial status provided for the purpose of obtaining benefits and advantages of whatever type foreseen by specific laws;

- $\cdot$  dispensation from specific tax obligations, with an indication of the amount;
- · tax code or VAT number;
- any information contained in tax register;
- · unemployment status;
- $\cdot\,$  pensioner status and category of pension;
- student status;
- · housewife status;
- · status as legal representative of physical or legal persons, guardian, trustee and similar;
- membership in social groups or associations of whatever type;
- · fulfilment or not of military obligations;
- · lack of criminal record;
- · status of dependency on someone;

 $\cdot$  all the information directly known by the person concerned which figure in the public register of births, marriages and deaths.
