The MEDISS project addresses the issue of improving groundwater quality in the Mediterranean area according to the specific characteristics and needs of the partner areas - Palestine (Jordan Valley), Jordan (Aqaba Governorate), Italy (Arborea) and Tunisia (Gabès). MEDISS experiments with innovative solutions in the use of treated wastewater and in the desalination of brackish water. Specific awareness-raising initiatives for end-users will challenge their reluctance towards non-conventional water resources (NCWR) and train them on best agricultural

practices. In the long term, the project will contribute to reducing stress on freshwater, as well as costs for water supply. At the same time, increased productivity and crop diversification will increase food security and income for farmers.
