Art. 1 - Ph.D. programmes

For the academic year 2026/2027 (Cycle 42) the University of Cagliari (UniCa) announces public selections for its Ph.D. programmes, listed below:

For each Ph.D. programme, specific details are given in annexes available at https://web.unica.it/unica/it/studenti_s01_ss05.page, forming an integral part of the present Notice of Competition and including: scientific and disciplinary areas, Coordinator's name, location, possible affiliated institutions, duration, research topics and educational objectives, university degree required to access the Ph.D. programme, admission tests; positions and scholarships with indication of the funding; contact person(s). Any updated information will be published on the same webpage.

The available positions are 149: 109 are ordinary and supported by a scholarship, 17 are without a scholarship; 23 positions are reserved: 19 of them, with scholarship, are reserved for foreign applicants holding a degree issued abroad, 2 are reserved for scholarship recipients from foreign countries and 2 are reserved for international mobility scholarship recipients).

Pursuant to the applicable legislation, the activation of unfunded positions is permitted up to a maximum ratio of one unfunded position for every three funded positions. Accordingly, the activation of such positions is subject to verification that this ratio is maintained.

For PhD programmes that, during the planning and accreditation process, have provided for positions without a scholarship, any waiver of the scholarship by successful candidates, including medical residents and public-sector employees, does not automatically result in the conversion of a scholarship-funded position into a position without a scholarship.

For PhD programmes that, during the planning and accreditation process, have not provided for positions without a scholarship, the activation of each position is subject to acceptance of the corresponding scholarship.

Any scholarships not awarded following the selection procedures launched under this Call for Applications will be made available through a subsequent Call for Applications.

Positions reserved for foreign candidates with a degree obtained abroad, if not appointed, may be made available as ordinary positions.

There are 128 scholarships available for attending doctoral programmes: 68 scholarships funded through resources from the Regional Programme – European Social Fund Plus 2021–2027 – PR Sardegna FSE+ 2021–2027, for STEP scholarships, of which 39 scholarships under Area of Intervention 145a – Digital technologies and deep-tech innovation, 14 under Area of Intervention 145a – Biotechnologies, and 14 under Area of Intervention 145b – Clean and resource-efficient technologies;

36 scholarships funded through the University budget, resources from the “five per thousand” (5x1000) allocation for the 2024 financial year, third-party funds earmarked for PhD programmes, and MUR funds for postgraduate scholarships;

scholarships funded through resources allocated by the universities participating in the PhD programmes in Capacity Building for Global Health – 3 scholarships: 1 by the University of Ferrara, 1 by the University of Foggia, and 1 by the University of Salerno – and in Data Science – 5 scholarships: 1 by the University of Messina, 1 by the University of Naples Federico II, 1 by the University of Pavia, 1 by the University of Salento, and 1 by the University of Campania “Luigi Vanvitelli”;

The STEP scholarships funded through resources from the **PR Sardegna FSE+ 2021–2027**, Priority 6, *“STEP Employment and Training (Strategic Technologies for Europe Platform)”*, Specific Objective ESO4.7, *“Promoting lifelong learning, in particular flexible upskilling and reskilling opportunities for all, taking into account entrepreneurial and digital skills, better anticipating change and new skills requirements based on labour market needs, facilitating career transitions and promoting professional mobility (ESF+)”*, are aimed at strengthening human capital by enhancing skills relevant to the development and production of critical STEP technologies, with particular reference to digital and deep technologies, biotechnologies, and clean and resource-efficient technologies.

The scholarships are intended for the implementation of research projects falling within the following fields of intervention:

Area of Intervention 145a – Digital Technologies and Deep Tech Innovation

Scholarships are awarded for research projects aimed at developing advanced knowledge and skills in the fields of digital technologies and deep technologies (deep tech), with particular emphasis on highly innovative strategic technologies that contribute to digital transformation, enhance the competitiveness of the productive system, and strengthen the research and innovation ecosystem.

Area of Intervention 145a – Biotechnologies

Scholarships are awarded for research projects focusing on the development and application of innovative biotechnological technologies, with the aim of generating new knowledge, processes, products and high value-added services across the various fields of biotechnology, in line with European objectives for innovation and technological development.

Area of Intervention 145b – Clean and Resource-Efficient Technologies

Scholarships are awarded for research projects aimed at developing clean, sustainable and resource-efficient technologies capable of contributing to the ecological transition, decarbonisation, the circular economy, energy efficiency and the sustainable use of natural resources, in line with the European objectives of the green transition.

The PhD programme, including training, research and evaluation activities, must be carried out predominantly in Sardinia, without prejudice to periods of study and research abroad, which must be planned consistently with the training and research activities to be carried out at the premises of the proposing institution.

Research projects associated with the PR FSE+ 2021-2027 grants must be developed during the doctoral programme in accordance with the horizontal principles (Art. 9 Reg. 2021/1060 and Art. 6 and 8 Reg. 2021/1057 FSE+) referred to in the introduction to this call for applications.

The University of Cagliari complies with the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union and the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

All the programmes, lasting three years, include a mandatory training period abroad with a minimum duration of 6 months and a maximum of 12 months, extendable up to 18 months for doctorates in cotutelle with foreign universities.

The number of scholarships may increase in the event of further public and/or private funding, subject to the completion of the administrative steps before the completion of the enrolment

procedure. Scholarships funded by external institutions will be awarded depending on the transfer of funds to UniCa.

The awarding of scholarships financed/co-financed by external institutions is conditional on the transfer of the relevant funds to the University of Cagliari.

Ph.D. programmes will start only if at least three applicants will be selected for each programme, and if they complete the enrolment procedure.

Ph.D. programmes last 3 years and are going to start on 16th November 2026.

Art. 2 - Eligibility requirements for selection

Admission to Ph.D. programmes is open to graduates, regardless of nationality, that, by the deadline of the competition, hold (ref. to the [Italian university system](#)):

- a degree awarded according to the Italian Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004 (*laurea magistrale*);
- a degree awarded according to the Italian Ministerial Decree no. 509/1999 (*laurea specialistica*);
- a degree awarded according to the regulations established before the Italian Ministerial Decree no. 509/1999 (*laurea*);
- academic qualification (2nd cycle university degree: Master-level) issued by a foreign university recognized as equivalent. The foreign university degree must be evaluated as suitable and equivalent, in terms of duration, level of degree and fields of study to the degree listed above and providing access to Ph.D. programmes in the awarding country.

The Selection Committee will deliberate on its equivalence, in compliance with the current legislation in Italy and in the Country where it was issued, and with the international treaties or agreements concerning the recognition of qualifications for further studies for the sole purpose of the admission to the Ph.D. programme.

The admission is also open to students who are going to graduate by 31st October 2026. These candidates will be admitted with reservation and will submit a certificate (only for degrees obtained abroad) or a self-declaration of their graduation together with a scanned copy of a valid ID/passport. The certificate/self-declaration should be sent to dottoratiemaster@unica.it.

The degree must be obtained in any case before the enrolment. If the applicant is evaluated positively to be admitted to a Ph.D. programme but he/she will not be awarded the necessary degree by the above-mentioned date, he/she will lose that suitable position.

Art. 3 - How to apply

The **application** must be submitted, along with the relevant attachments, under penalty of exclusion, electronically using the computerized procedure "PICA - Integrated Platform for University Competitions", at the address <https://pica.cineca.it/login>. **from the date of the publication of the present Notice of Competition to 28th September 2026 at 23:59 (local time).**

It is possible to access the computer application via SPID, by choosing the University of Cagliari from the list of available federations; alternatively, the application will necessarily require an email address to register with the system.

The candidate must enter all the required data to complete the application.

The application for participation must be completed in all its parts, as indicated in the electronic procedure.

No other forms of submission of applications or documentation for participation in the procedure are allowed.

According to the Italian Presidential Decree no. 445/2000, art. 46, applicants must provide the following information for the online procedure:

- a. name and surname, Italian tax identification code (*codice fiscale*) – for candidates applying for the first time, place and date of birth, residence address, telephone number, e-mail and current address where any possible correspondence related to the selection can be sent;
- b. citizenship;
- c. exact name of the selected Ph.D. programme;
- d. name of the University degree, date of graduation, final grade, name of the issuing University;
- e. to possess the eligibility requirements reported in the notice of competition and to be aware of the text of the notice;
- f. to be aware of being subject to penalty if any information provided is later found to be untrue according to Italian Presidential Decree no. 445/2000, art. 76;
- g. to have read the [notice](#) no. 2016/679 issued according to the EU Regulations and the Italian Law in force, about the protection of people regarding the treatment of personal data, as well as on the free circulation of data;
- h. to give the consent to communicate and disseminate his/her own personal data for the purposes of the present Ph.D. notice of competition.

According to art. 20 of Italian Law no. 104/92, applicants with disabilities must specify in their application the required assistance for their needs, including possible requests for additional time for the completion of the tests, by sending an e-mail to the [Ph.D., Professional Master's, Visiting Professor Office](#), which could involve SIA - UniCa Office for Disability.

The sensitive data reported for this purpose will be kept secret and processed in accordance with the provisions currently in force.

In accordance with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, all forms of communication adopted by the University of Cagliari are designed to ensure accessibility for persons with disabilities. The effectiveness of communication will also be assessed through questionnaires and surveys.

TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SELECTION, APPLICANTS MUST PAY A FEE OF EUR 26.80, NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

The fee of EUR 26.80 can be paid through PagoPA system, according to the Instructions. Paying the selection fee is essential for completing registration for the competition.

- Self-certification of the examinations taken throughout the applicant's entire university career (single-cycle Master's degree; Master's degree + Bachelor's degree; second-cycle degree + Bachelor's degree; degree awarded under the previous academic system; equivalent qualifications), including the grades obtained and the corresponding credits.

APPLICANTS HOLDING A FOREIGN DEGREE

- Certificate issued by the awarding university confirming possession of the foreign second-cycle/single-cycle degree required for admission to the PhD programme, including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations and the final degree grade, the date of enrolment and the date the degree was awarded, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English;
- Certificate issued by the awarding university confirming possession of the foreign first-cycle degree, including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations and the final degree grade, the date of enrolment and

the date the degree was awarded, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English (only for degree programmes structured over two cycles).

APPLICANTS WHO HAVE NOT YET OBTAINED THE FOREIGN QUALIFICATION REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION TO THE PhD PROGRAMME

- Certificate issued by the awarding university, listing the examinations taken as part of the second-cycle/single-cycle degree programme, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations taken, the date of enrolment and the expected date of award of the degree, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English;
- Certificate issued by the awarding university confirming possession of the foreign first-cycle degree, including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations and the final degree grade, the date of enrolment and the date the degree was awarded, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English (only for degree programmes structured over two cycles).

FOR ALL CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR ORDINARY POSITIONS

Applicants holding a foreign academic qualification who apply for positions reserved for international candidates must upload the following documents in PDF format through the online application system:

FOREIGN APPLICANTS HOLDING A FOREIGN DEGREE

- Certificate issued by the awarding university confirming possession of the foreign second-cycle/single-cycle degree required for admission to the PhD programme, including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations and the final degree grade, the date of enrolment and the date the degree was awarded, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English;
- Certificate issued by the awarding university confirming possession of the foreign first-cycle degree, including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations and the final degree grade, the date of enrolment and the date the degree was awarded, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English (only for degree programmes structured over two cycles).

FOREIGN APPLICANTS WHO HAVE NOT YET OBTAINED THE FOREIGN QUALIFICATION REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION TO THE PhD PROGRAMME

- Certificate issued by the awarding university, listing the examinations taken as part of the second-cycle/single-cycle degree programme, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations taken, the date of enrolment and the expected date of award of the degree, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English;
- Certificate issued by the awarding university confirming possession of the foreign first-cycle degree, including the list of examinations taken, the corresponding grades and credits, the average examination grade, the minimum and maximum grading scales applicable to the examinations and the final degree grade, the date of enrolment and the date the degree was awarded, accompanied by a translation into Italian or English (only for degree programmes structured over two cycles).

FOR ALL FOREIGN CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR RESERVED POSITIONS

- Any other documents that may be taken into consideration for evaluation purposes (relating to postgraduate qualifications; language certificates; other qualifications and/or activities relevant to admission to the PhD programme; publications) and/or that are specified as mandatory for the PhD programme concerned in the relevant programme information sheet annexed to the Call for Applications;
- A colour scan of both sides of a valid identity document, with a clear photograph (for international candidates, a colour scan of the identification pages of a valid passport,

which must not expire within six months following the deadline of the Call for Applications, with a clear photograph);

- Letters of reference: the application must be supported by up to three letters of recommendation from university academics and/or experts in the research fields relevant to the PhD programme. The letters must be prepared exclusively using the template available at https://web.unica.it/unica/en/studenti_s01_ss05.page ("Instructions for Application and Forms" – Reference Letter Template), written in English, printed on the official letterhead of the referee's institution, dated and signed.

The letters must be sent by the referees, no later than 28th September 2026, to phdcall_referenceletter@unica.it, indicating in the subject line the surname and first name of the applicant and the name of the PhD programme for which the application has been submitted. Letters uploaded directly by applicants or submitted through any other means will not be taken into consideration.

Where a foreign academic qualification has already been formally recognised as equivalent to one of the academic qualifications referred to in Article 2, applicants must indicate the Italian university that granted the equivalence, together with the number and date of the relevant Rector's Decree.

Where the foreign academic qualification has not been declared equivalent, the Admissions Committee shall assess its suitability in accordance with the applicable legislation in force in Italy and in the country where the qualification was awarded, as well as with the relevant international treaties and agreements on the recognition of qualifications for the purpose of further study. Such assessment shall be carried out solely for the purpose of admission to the PhD programme.

According to art. 40 of the Italian Presidential Decree no. 445/2000, public bodies can no longer receive or request from private citizens certificates issued by other public institutions. Therefore, all qualifications must be provided only through a self-declaration of certifications or a self-declaration affidavit, according to articles 46 and 47 of the Italian Presidential Decree mentioned above.

Publications and other qualifications issued by private bodies, which cannot be self-declared, must be provided in PDF format together with a self-declaration affidavit attesting their conformity to the original version, according to the articles 19 and 19-bis of the same Italian Presidential Decree.

EU citizens can submit their replacement declarations according to articles 46, 47, 19 and 19-bis of the Italian Presidential Decree no. 445/2000.

Non-EU citizens, legally resident in Italy, can provide the above-mentioned replacement declarations, only with reference to situations, personal qualities and facts which can be certified or attested by Italian public bodies.

The absence of even one of the attachments required by this article will result in exclusion from the competition procedure.

THE PROCEDURE FOR COMPLETING AND SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION AND ATTACHMENTS ELECTRONICALLY MUST BE COMPLETED BY NO LATER THAN 28th SEPTEMBER 2026 AT 23:59 (LOCAL TIME).

The date of electronic submission of the application for participation in the competition is certified by the computer system through a receipt, which will be automatically sent via email. Upon expiration of the deadline for submission, the system will no longer allow access to or submission of the electronic form.

Each application will be assigned an identification number, which along with the competition code indicated in the computer application, must be specified for any subsequent communication.

In the case of access via SPID, no signature will be required during the application submission. If accessing the system through another method, the submission of the application for participation must be completed and finalized through digital or handwritten signature, as indicated below:

- a) Through digital signature, using a smart card, USB token, or remote signature, which allow the holder to sign generic documents using signature software on a PC or a web portal for Remote Signature made available by the Certifier. Those with a smart card or USB token for Digital Signature can verify compatibility with the Digital Signature system integrated into the server system. Upon successful verification, the holder can sign the application directly on the server (e.g., ConFirma). Those without compatible digital signature devices and holders of Remote Digital Signatures who have access to a portal for signing generic documents must save the PDF file generated by the system to their PC and, without making any modifications, digitally sign it in CAdES format: a .p7m file extension will be generated, which must then be uploaded back into the system. Any modification made to the file before the application of the Digital Signature will prevent the automatic verification of correspondence between the content of the document and the original, resulting in exclusion of the application;
- b) By handwritten signature: if it is not possible to use one of the options mentioned above, the candidate must save the PDF file generated by the system on their PC and, without making any changes, print it and sign the full handwritten signature on the last page of the printed

document. This completed document must be scanned into PDF format, and the resulting file must be uploaded into the system.

All applicants are admitted conditionally to the selection, and can be excluded in any moment, also after the admission tests, for lack of the requirements of this notice of competition.

The University will check the truthfulness of candidates' self-declarations/affidavits.

Without prejudice to criminal sanctions under the Penal Code and the related special laws (articles 75 and 76 of the Italian Presidential Decree no. 445/2000), if the University administrative offices detect that the information declared by the applicant is mendacious or false, he/she will not be able to enrol.

Art. 4 - Admission tests

Admission to the PhD programme is subject to successfully passing the public selection procedure, which is designed to assess the applicant's academic preparation and aptitude for scientific research, while also taking into account the horizontal principles referred to in the recitals of this Call for Applications.

- written test+interview or interview

The Selection Committee could define the assessment criteria and assess the qualifications also remotely.

Applicants who pass the preliminary assessment of the coherence of the research project, as described in Article 2, are eligible for evaluation of their qualifications.

Foreign candidates holding a degree obtained abroad, applying for the reserved positions, will be selected on the basis of the evaluation of their degrees, CVs and interview, as detailed in each Ph.D. programme Annex. The evaluation criteria are established by the Selection Committee which has a total of 100 points, distributed as follows:

up to a maximum of 40 points ▪ CV

up to a maximum of 20 points ▪ reference letters

up to a maximum of 40 points ▪ interview

The Selection Committee could define the assessment criteria and assess the qualifications also by video conference.

Applicants who pass the preliminary assessment of the coherence of the research project, as described in Article 2, are eligible for evaluation of their qualifications.

Candidates who obtain at least 30 points in the evaluation of their qualifications and curriculum vitae (university career and experience and other qualifications) are admitted to the interview. Art. 5 - Selection Committees

The Rector appoints the Selection Committees, upon proposal by the Ph.D. programme Academic Board. Each Committee is composed, in respect, if possible, of gender balance, of three or five effective members and two alternates, identified among professors, university researchers and experts in possession of high and proven scientific or professional qualification in the disciplinary areas of the Ph.D. programme.

The Selection Committees will be able to carry out their functions with the aid of telematic tools. The Rector's decree appointing the Selection Committees will be published on https://web.unica.it/unica/en/studenti_s01_ss05.page, after the deadline for the submission of applications.

Art. 6 - Rankings

The Selection Committees will draw up the ranking list, on the basis of the applicants' comparative evaluation, carried out in accordance with the criteria set out for the admission to

each Ph.D. programme, considering the total scores of each candidate. In case of candidates obtaining the same ranking position, the younger will prevail.

Art. 7 - Admission to Ph.D. programmes

Candidates are admitted to Ph.D. programmes according to the ranking list and the number of positions available for the selected Ph.D. programme.

In the event of failure to enrol within the prescribed date, of renunciation of the eligible candidates before the start of the courses, of forfeiture due to ascertained non-truthfulness of the substitutive declarations submitted, or of forfeiture due to failure to obtain the qualification for access to the doctorate within the deadline referred to in art. 2, the same number of candidates will take over according to the order of the ranking.

Taking over after the start of the courses can be allowed no later than the following two months, subject to obtaining the favourable opinion of the Academic Board.

If a candidate is admitted contemporarily to several Ph.D. programmes, he/she can choose only one of them.

Waiver from the Ph.D. programme submitted after the completion of enrolment will result in the obligation to pay the stamp duty of EUR 16.00.

Public employees admitted to Ph.D. programmes benefit, for the normal duration of the programme, from the leave provided for by collective bargaining or, if employed under public law, from extraordinary leave for study purposes, compatibly with the needs of the administration, pursuant to art. 2 of Law no. 476 of 13th August 1984, with or without grants and unless explicitly waived, only if enrolled for the first time in a doctoral programme, regardless of the subject area.

The students of a postgraduate medical school who are the winners of the competition for admission to a Ph.D. programme organized by the University of Cagliari may be admitted to the

joint attendance of the specialization school and of the Ph.D. programme, with possible reduction of the duration of the doctorate to a minimum of two years, with the authorization, respectively, of the Board of the specialization school and the Academic Board of the doctorate, issued after evaluation of the compatibility of the activities and of the commitment required by the specialization school and the doctoral programme, also in consideration of the distance between the respective locations.

Medical residents admitted to concurrent enrolment in the PhD programme may not receive the PhD scholarship until the overlapping period between the two programmes has ended.

Art. 8 - Enrolment in Ph.D. programmes

In Italy, the official centre belonging to the NARIC (National Academic Recognition Information Centres) network of the European Union and the ENIC (European National Information Centres) network of the Council of Europe and UNESCO is CIMEA.

4. the original or a certified true copy of the first-cycle academic qualification (only where the university education is structured in two cycles).

The enrolment procedure will be completed when the Ph.D. and Professional Master office of the University of Cagliari will have verified the completeness and accuracy of the application and the required documents, as well as the receipt of the EUR 16.00 payment, within the deadline above.

Those successful candidates who do not comply with the requirements for their enrolment, will automatically be considered as withdrawn and the next candidate(s) in the ranking list will take their place; the University office will inform by e-mail the next candidates and invite them to enrol within a deadline specified in the email. Successful candidates must provide a self-certification attached to the application and declare:

- to be/not to be enrolled in another degree programme, professional master or non-medical specialization course;
- to be/not to be enrolled in medical schools of specialization;
- to be/not be enrolled – and commit not to enrol – in another Ph.D. programme for the entire duration of the Ph.D. programme;
- to have/not to have been previously awarded another scholarship for a Ph.D. programme, even if partially;
- to receive/not to receive a research grant;

- to be aware that the admission to a doctorate entails an exclusive and full-time commitment, without prejudice to the law in force;
- to undertake to carry out the activities of the doctorate assiduously and to fulfil the educational obligations according to the programme and in compliance with the deadlines scheduled by the Academic Board, also with reference to the level of knowledge of English to be acquired at the end of the doctorate, and to carrying out, over the three-year period, research and training activities consistent with the doctoral project, at university institutions or highly qualified foreign research bodies, for a period of a mandatory minimum duration of 6 months;
- to undertake to ask the Academic Board for authorization to carry out tutoring activities for the students of 1st and 2nd level degree courses, even paid; supplementary teaching activities within the limit of forty hours for each academic year; paid work activity, even if already existing at the time of enrolment in the doctorate;
- to be aware that the scholarships are granted to students whose annual gross income does not exceed the amount of EUR 16,243.00;
- not to exceed a gross income of EUR 16,243.00 for the fiscal years 2026 and 2027; and to communicate promptly if this limit has been exceeded, so losing the right to the scholarship and paying back the monthly amount of the scholarship received during the year in which the limit has been exceeded;

The successful candidate must also issue a specific declaration for the purposes of awarding the PR ESF+ 2021-2027 STEP grant, in which he/she accepts the grant and:

Art. 9 - Taxes and fees

The Ph.D. students are exempted from paying an enrolment and attendance fee. Art. 10 - Scholarships

As indicated for each Ph.D. programme in art. 1 and in Annexes published on the webpage https://web.unica.it/unica/en/studenti_s01_ss05.page, scholarships will be awarded with Rector's Decree on the basis of the rankings drawn up by the Selection Committees, also considering the eligibility evaluations on the candidates' projects as well as the selection results. Research-themed scholarships are awarded exclusively to candidates who are successfully placed in the merit ranking and who have obtained the highest score and a positive evaluation by the Selection Committee regarding the suitability of their curriculum vitae for the specific theme of the scholarship.

The PR ESF+ 2021-2027 STEP scholarships will be awarded to candidates who are successfully placed in the merit ranking.

Scholarship granting procedures, as well as information about fulfilments needed to allocate them, will be published on the webpage mentioned above.

The scholarships have a total duration of three years and are confirmed annually with managerial provision, provided that the Ph.D. student has completed the programme of activities planned for the previous year, verified by the Academic Board.

The annual amount of the scholarship is EUR 16,243.00, gross of tax deduction (INPS "*Gestione Separata*" to the beneficiary: 1/3) and net of the University deduction (2/3).

The amount of the scholarship is increased to 50%, according and proportionally to the duration of the Ph.D. student's stay abroad at universities or research institutions, when he/she is authorized by the Academic Board or, upon its delegation, by the coordinator, if the stay does not exceed 3 months. The increase on the scholarship is not paid when the Ph.D. student stays in his/her country of origin or residence, except for exceptions authorized by the Rector in relation to special cases.

The scholarships are paid out exclusively to Ph.D. students not receiving an annual gross income higher than EUR 16,243.00. Exceeding that limit will result in the loss of the scholarship and implies the duty to give back the monthly payments already received for a specific year.

The revocation of the scholarship, with the consequent obligation for the beneficiary to refund the total or partial sums received, is made in case of: failure to carry out the scheduled periods of study and research abroad, pursuant to art. 12 par. 2 of the University Regulations on Ph.D. programme; negative assessment of the Academic Board and the consequent non-admission to the following year of the doctoral Ph.D. programme; waiver from the scholarship; failure to obtain the Ph.D. degree at the completion of the Ph.D. programme.

The Ph.D. scholarships cannot be added to other grants awarded for any purpose, nor to any other research grants/contracts.

Furthermore, Ph.D. scholarships are incompatible with emoluments, however named, received in relation to the activities of medical specialization schools. Therefore, the scholarships assigned to the trainees admitted to the joint attendance of the medical specialization course and the Ph.D. programme will be paid exclusively from the date of termination of the overlapping period, reduced by the accruals relating to the aforementioned period, which cannot be recovered.

The scholarships will be paid in monthly deferred payments. The payment of the first monthly instalment will be done after the conclusion of the administrative and fiscal procedures needed to allocate them, after Ph.D. students will have provided all the relevant documents.

Those Ph.D. students who benefited, although partially, of a Ph.D. scholarship in the past, cannot apply a second time for another Ph.D. scholarship.

Art. 11 - Ph.D. students' attendance and obligations

The Ph.D. programme entails an exclusive and full-time commitment.

The Ph.D. students are required to carry out the Ph.D. activities assiduously and to fulfil the educational obligations according to the programme and in compliance with the deadlines approved by the Academic Board, also with reference to the level of knowledge of English to be acquired at the conclusion of the doctorate, and to carry out, over the three-year period, research and training activities consistent with the doctoral project, at highly qualified foreign university institutions or research institutions, for a period with a mandatory minimum duration of 6 months.

The Ph.D. students can work as tutors, provide integrative teaching activity and be employed according to the Rules and Regulations about Ph.D. programmes in force at UniCa.

At the end of each academic year, the Academic Board evaluates the Ph.D. student's activity, through appropriate forms of assessment, under which he/she can be admitted to the following year or, on a reasoned decision, excluded in the event of a negative evaluation. The exclusion from the programme may be asked also in case of non-participation in the organized activities, unjustified and prolonged absences, or if the Ph.D. student works without the prior authorization of the Academic Board.

Being excluded means losing the Ph.D. student's position and the scholarship.

The excluded Ph.D. student cannot enrol again in the same doctorate.

Attendance of the doctorate and the disbursement of any scholarship received are suspended in cases of maternity, paternity and parental leave and serious and prolonged duly documented disease.

They can also be suspended, for a maximum duration of six months, at the request of the Ph.D. student, with the favourable opinion of the Academic Board, for serious and proven family reasons.

The suspension period, during which the Ph.D. student retains the right to any scholarship received, must be recovered at the end of the three-year legal duration of the doctorate.

At the end of the suspension period, the disbursement of the scholarship starts from the resumption of attendance of the Ph.D. programme, up to the total duration of the scholarship.

Obligations related to PR ESF+ 2021-2027 scholarships:

Recipients of PR ESF+ 2021-2027 scholarship s are required to:

- carry out the research project associated with the grant, in compliance with the specific principles and obligations of the PR FSE+ 2021-2027 referred to in the introduction to this call for applications;

- complete the period of study and research abroad, as provided for in the doctoral programme associated with the scholarship;
- report on their activities every six months by completing a report summarising the main training and research activities carried out, indicating the time commitment involved, verified and validated by the coordinator;
- prepare and submit to the coordinator an annual report on the activities carried out.

Art. 12 - Award of the Ph.D. degree

The Ph.D. degree is awarded upon completion of the Ph.D. programme, after passing a final examination, consisting in the defence of a Ph.D. thesis that contributes to the advancement of knowledge or methodologies in the chosen field of investigation, in front of a Selection Committee, selected and appointed according to the Rules and Regulations on Ph.D. programmes.

Art. 13 - Simultaneous enrolment

Enrolment in the Ph.D. programme is incompatible with enrolment in another Ph.D. programme - except in cases of joint supervision of theses - and in a bachelor's or master's degree programme with compulsory attendance, at the University of Cagliari or at other Italian and foreign universities, as well as with research contracts referred to in Article 22 of Law No. 240 of 30 December 2010, as amended.

Simultaneous enrolment in a Ph.D. programme and a bachelor's or master's degree programme with non-compulsory attendance is permitted.

Simultaneous enrolment in a Ph.D. programme and a non-medical specialisation course is also permitted, subject to a positive assessment of the compatibility of the attendance requirement with the conditions for acquiring the knowledge and skills necessary to achieve the educational objectives of each course, as expressed by the respective governing bodies.

Simultaneous enrolment in a Ph.D. programme and a medical specialisation course is permitted under the conditions referred to in Article 7.

Simultaneous enrolment in a Ph.D. programme and a master's degree programme is subject to a positive assessment by the respective governing bodies, subject to verification of the conditions for acquiring the knowledge and skills necessary to achieve the educational objectives of each programme.

Art. 14 - Personal data treatment

The University of Cagliari is the controller for the personal data treatment, according to the EU Regulations 2016/679 about the protection of individuals with regard to the treatment of

persona data, as well as the free circulation of these data and the Code regarding the protection of personal data - Legislative Decree n. 196/2003, respecting human dignity, fundamental rights and freedoms of the person.
